An informal relational network and local hub (net-hub) in the Geneva area to encourage mutual learning-support for GMH

- Connecting colleagues from various organisations-backgrounds and GMH interests (governmental and inter-governmental agencies, NGOs and academic institutions, etc.; students professors, interns, leaders, users, practitioners, health minsters, etc.)
- Offering and co-sponsoring a variety of GMH-related events in the Geneva area (symposia, workshops, conferences, formal/informal briefings, roundtables, socials) including webcasts for colleagues internationally.
- Emphasizing health-wellbeing with a special focus on GMH in relation to: vulnerable populations, priority MNS conditions, human rights, social determinants of health, research, good practice, integrative health policies/programmes, people affected by conflicts and calamities, humanitarian personnel, and work-life balance for ourselves as colleagues.
- Linking relationally with broader health-related networks, including MGMH.
- Providing e-updates and web information related to GMH-Geneva.
- Encouraging the development of other GMH net-hubs internationally.

GMH is an international, interdisciplinary, and multi-sectoral domain which promotes human wellbeing, the right to health, and equity in health for all. It encourages healthy behaviors and lifestyles; is committed to preventing and treating mental, neurological, and substance use conditions (MNS); and seeks to improve policies and programs, professional practices and research, advocacy and awareness, and social and environmental factors that affect health and wellbeing. Net-hubs, comprised of a diverse group of practitioners serving humanity, can play a helpful role in the GMH domain.
