Here are some core resources in global mental health (GMH) to support the work in the health and other sectors and to support the efforts towards sustainable development. They overview the various facets of GMH and include links to materials from around the world. Some examples of GMH resources/links are the WHO <u>Mental Health Action Plan 2013-2020</u>; the WHO <u>MINDbank</u> online data base; and the brief advocacy article by Patel and Saxena, "<u>Transforming Lives, Enhancing Communities</u>" (2014, New England Journal of Medicine).

Resource 1. Global Mental Health: A Resource Map for Connecting and Contributing

(*Psychology International*, July 2011). This brief article provides a 60 minute overview of GMH via links to 10 written/multimedia resources on the web. It's a great way to quickly see the big picture.

Resource 2. Global Mental Health: Finding Your Niches and Networks

(*Psychology International*, March 2012). This brief article builds upon the first article. It identifies 10 overlapping areas of GMH (niche-nets) with links to current web resources for each area.

Resource 3. Global Mental Health: A Resource Primer for Exploring the Domain

(International Perspectives in Psychology: Research, Practice, Consultation, July 2012). This is a major research article with an extensive listing of GMH resources, prioritizing materials from the last 10 years. The resources are categorized into six areas: organizations, publications, conferences, training, human rights, and humanitarian.

Resource 4. Global Mental Health: Strategies for Staying Current

(*Psychology International*, March 2014). This brief article describes seven areas of "GMH Flows" to help stay updated with GMH and its inclusion in different sectors and health/development agendas.

Resource 5. Tracking and Trekking with Global Mental Health (draft, July 2014)

This brief article article emphasizes GMH-related conferences/consultation over the past two years. Colleagues can still participate in many of these events via the links to the online power points/videos.
